

Iberdrola and CDTI invest in the firm Arbórea Intellbird

Madrid, 6 June (EFECOM) Iberdrola and the Centre for Technological Development in Industry, a branch of the Ministry of Economy and Competitiveness have agreed to invest €500,000 in the Salamanca-based firm, Arbórea Intellbird, specialised in unmanned aerial vehicles.

According to the announcement, it is the first investment that has been made within the framework of the programme Innvierte for Energy and Environmental use.

Iberdrola has invested capital through its Perseo funds and the goal of the initiative is to encourage the development of this company and strengthen it within its sector.

The electric company has an agreement with CDTI to invest more than €25 million in new technology for the energy sector.

Arbórea Intellbird's headquarters are in the University of Salamanca's Science Park and it is focused on the manufacturing of unmanned aerial vehicles for a variety of professional uses, among them, the inspection of electricity production and distribution infrastructures.

Its first product, the aracnocóptero Eol6, is a foldable helicopter that inspects wind turbine blades. EFECOM
